Conditions in WW SSB were unusual and in spite of this fact there were some great efforts and performances and it was great to see so many other scores submitted. As good as the big scores are to see, it is the "Average Joe" that makes the difference for Team YCCC. I hope that we will have an even stronger turnout for the CW half of the contest. We have a great start on the Blitz for Six and with a good effort from all of us a sixth consecutive CQWW win is quite possible. Please make sure that your CQWW CW score is submitted to <a href="cw@cqww.com">cw@cqww.com</a> by January 14<sup>th</sup>, 2004.

With CQWW out of the way we will need to start to turn our attention to other efforts. ARRL DX is the next major contests/ Are you planning to operate for ARRL? FRC took one of these from us last year. Are we going to let that happen again? I hope not! We need to make a stronger effort that before on ARRL DX CW and SSB if we are to maintain our superiority over FRC. I hope everyone of you is planning to make a serious effort to support us in the Blitz for Six in ARRL DX in the CW contest on February 21-22, 2004 and the SSB contest on March 6-7, 2004. ARRL DX is where the world needs to work the states for multipliers, and we can really run the bands with better rates because they need to work us! Please set these dates aside now so that we can have everyone on the air for these contests.

I have received many comments from folks about a desire to perhaps chase another contest as a club effort. This was discussed before and there has been some interest. Do we want to consider that in the 2004-2005 season? Maybe we should discuss this in the upcoming meetings, if you have an opinion on this issue perhaps you can come and voice them. Sweepstakes or WPX are both great contests and maybe others. Let us consider it and discuss it. The big DX contests may well always be the cream of the crop, and we have had such a long history in this area. It is worth discussing and I

think there are many opinions on this. Bring yours to the meetings and we can discuss this.

We have been working to amass the scores for awards, and although they may not be ready in time for the December meeting please know they are coming. With the business of CQWW it will be much easier for us to get the awards done for February's meeting.

Some of you may have noticed that we have had some difficulties with the web site. #### YCCC Regular Meeting October 11, 2003 Worcester State College

Chris N1XS managed to break the pizza and soda pileup to call the meeting to order at 1:30pm. The attendees introduced themselves and briefly stated their operating plans, locations and scoring objectives for the forthcoming contest season.

Chris reported on the excellent results at M/M K1TTT in September's CQ/RJ WWDX RTTY Contest.

Ed K1EP reported a treasury balance of about \$6,500. The treasurer's report was followed by a spirited discussion of whether YCCC should make an additional contribution to Bill Fisher W4AN for support of his websites, eham.net and contesting.com (which also hosts the YCCC Reflector). Jerry K0TV moved to make a new donation of \$500. Don K2KQ pointed out that the previous donation this past Spring was understood to be a one-time decision and not a continuing commitment. Several members suggested allocating a specific portion of the club's annual budget for support of external organizations. Jerry later withdrew his motion. Jim K1IR suggested developing a proposal for allocating funds. Ed explained that at the present time the club does not have a formal itemized budget or budget process. Chris supports the development of a more formal budget to be proposed by the treasurer at a future general meeting.

The discussion migrated to a donation to ARRL in support of BPL opposition. K2KQ expressed criticism of ARRL's approach in opposing BPL so far. Don personally feels that BPL is a "stupid idea that will die a natural death because it is wholly non-secure." A motion was made and seconded to contribute \$100 to ARRL to support the League's efforts to oppose BPL. The motion carried by majority vote (33 in favor, 6 opposed).

Ray W1RY won the KAM XL TNC donated as a door prize by Dave K1TTT.

New member prospect, Chuck W1HIS, sponsored by W1EBI, was introduced and, to the surprise of none, was voted in as a new YCCC'er.

Chris announced that the next regular meeting will be Sunday, December 7, at WSC. K2KQ gave some hints about the meeting program, which will be managed by Dave K1NQ. Tentative presenters will include Fred Hopengarten K1VR on tower zoning approval issues; Randy Thompson K5ZD on small station contesting; and ARRL's Dean Straw N6BV on propagation topics. The February meeting manager and agenda have not been determined yet, but the tentative program includes a presentation and demo of the new Ten-

Tec Orion by Scott Robbins W4PA of Ten-Tec.

A general discussion of Logbook of the World followed. YCCC has the WT4I conversion tool to produce Cabrillo files from most logging programs if a member needs to use it.

A suggestion was raised about steps YCCC can take to stimulate interest in contesting generally and CW operating at Boxboro 2004. K2KQ described previous year activities in this area, including PED and RUFZ demos, contesting seminars at Boxboro and at the Milton (VT) hamfest, joint meetings with other clubs as well as invitations to other clubs to join our meetings.

Jack W1WEF proposed easing the meeting attendance requirement for club membership, suggesting this could be alternatively met via area meetings. Some strong contest stations are in locations too remote to attend a general meeting in the Worcester area. We should help maximize the club aggregate score by encouraging these more remote but very competitive stations to submit for YCCC. This might involve an amendment to the club bylaws.

Chris said we are still waiting for the release of final scores by CQ to the unlimited clubs in order to determine YCCC award winners for 2002. These awards should be ready for the December meeting.

K2KQ gave an ad lib presentation on VHF contesting in the absence of the planned presentation on this topic. Don's critical success factors: Location (#1); propagation (more critical than a "neat" callsign); aperture; ducting; skeds.

There was a brief discussion of whether the club should make a concerted effort in Sweepstakes. The general feeling was that the timing of SS was too inconvenient for many members to squeeze a serious effort in between CQWW weekends.

The meeting was adjourned at 3:40 pm.

#### Flotsam & Jetsam

Ahoy maties! You are probably reading this after the WW contests are history. As I'm writing early, WW Phone is over, and my feeling is that we whomped the competition. I hope I'm right, and that we beat them one more time on CW as well

I did a limited Sweepstakes CW operation this year because of a bad cold. Let's give serious consideration next year to see if we can take the unlimited club category in SS too! Congrats to Randy, K5ZD, for making top ten in SS from New England for what I believe is the first time this has ever been done. I know Randy, it ain't over 'til it's over, but I expect your top ten score to hold.

K1RM and I recently helped W1DAR dismantle his tower in anticipation of his planned move to RI. The first order of business was to take down the one year old HyGain 204BA. We had such a hard time with seized stainless steel bolts that we only got half as much work done as we could have. In talking to W1CKA about the problem, Paul said he has had great success with a product available in hardware stores called "Triflo" to free up frozen bolts. He says it is far better than Liquid Wrench (which never ever impressed me). Ralph, W1DAR, learned AFTER he put this antenna up that spraying the bolts with liquid teflon works well to prevent seizing. I'm sure other anti seize products do as well.



In preparation for this year's contests, I added a dozen more ground radials to my 160 Inverted L. Although I had a nice spool of new 16 ga insulated wire acquired at the last flea market (I never saw a spool of wire I didn't like for \$5), to my dismay I couldn't get solder to stick to the copper wire ring I used for the first 75 radials. It had been in place at least 5 years, and was not only oxidized badly but there was no room to easily add more radials. I decided to rework the whole base of the antenna, with new shiny copper and more room. While I have had good luck in the past with a propane

torch and solder tip, I decided to buy a Bernzomatic butane torch with solder tip that I had seen at Home Depot. I once used a Radio Shack butane torch in Curacao, but the wind would blow it out and it was useless. I found this new torch to be the cat's meow, used with or without the solder tip. When used without the tip it was hotter than necessary, so I heated the copper ring with the torch an inch or so away from where I was soldering. The cost was about \$25 plus the \$3 butane fuel.

In the process of doing the 160 rework, I was going to repackage the un-un that I used to match the vertical to the feedline. I had used the un-un for five years, and although the match seemed to still be pretty good, I found the high power Amidon Core I used had broken. I don't know if it broke from heat or if I damaged it when I accidentally torched a hole thru the side of the Rubbermaid container I packaged it in. For the time being, I eliminated the un-un and will live with the mismatch.

Here's a computer tip from the least expert computer wiz in the club ...(me). I just learned of a feature in Outlook Express that everyone else may already be familiar with. While in OE, click tools, then message rules, then mail, then NEW. You can list words that you don't want to be seeing in the subject line of legitimate mail, and block messages that have those words. My latest Internet Service Provider identifies SPAM by adding \*\*\*\*\*SPAM\*\*\*\*\* to the subject line on messages they think are SPAM. I put the word puts the word "SPAM" in my block list, and between that and a bunch of other words I won't list here, my spam is all but gone! Prior to doing this, more than half my email was garbage.

Last month's trivia question was "what member bailed out of his Pitts Special aerobatic plane before it crashed? Once again, the overwhelming response had it all wrong. That member was Charley Schwartz, W1TE. Bill mentioned that he knew a guy in Texas who restored a Pitts Special. That very plane turned out to be the one Charlie bought, and the only plane he ever bailed out of! While looking down at a map Charley saw flames and that was the end of his powered flight! Small world!
