CAPTAIN'S CABIN

Return to Normal?

We've all experienced an unprecedented upheaval in our lives that has lasted now for 14 months. An isolating and disturbing time, unprecedented level of social confusion in our lifetimes, great potential for impending illness, the specter of a lonely death, political disarray, commodity shortages.

But thru all of this, we've seen our hobby of Ham Radio shine through, displaying an international hope and an attitude of caring with messages of Stay Home, Be Safe, Be Well, and Good Health to you and your families being expressed universally.

Everyone has been touched in some way by this, and most will be touched by submitting to a virus test and likely an injection of a vaccine, in hopes that it would protect us from having severe symptoms which would force us to enter a hospital for care. While we've been home, Ham Radio contesting has seen a shift in the usual dynamics of operating and contesting and a surge of contest activity.

Social distancing had impacted nearly all Multi-Operator stations to be QRT, except for those who had already been dabbling in remote access technologies.

In our club these stations already had remote access for use in ARRL DX CW 2020: K2LE/1, K1TTT, WA1BXY, K1IR, N1MM, W1KM, K1ESE and others. Subsequently, many more members are trying the technology. Another impact was the freeing up of the spectrum that the QRT Multi-ops would have occupied, that allowed many more stations to try their hand at running on the bands.

Staying Home meant that many more could be active and on-the-air and it showed, even in mid-major and minor contests, activity and log submissions were setting records.

DXing has been a sad situation since mid-March of 2020, when the lockdowns came. Many big expeditions have cancelled or postponed their trips. Recent DX that was QRV: This month saw a Russian team at A25RU, VK's were on Cocos Keeling as VK9CE, a Russian team used snowmobiles to travel 1800km each way to activate RI0Q AS-152. W1-QSL Bureau Update


2020 was an interesting year for all of us including the Bureau. With the COVID restrictions our volume of cards coming in dropped to zero in March. Since then we started to get some boxes by summertime but still a much lower volume than in the past. The exception is that the German Bureau sent us three large (about 25 lbs each) boxes during 2020.

So far in 2021 the volume is starting to pick up mostly from 4 more of the large DL boxes. Those boxes also have batches of cards from other EU countries. A few other countries are starting to send shipments. The DX bureaus probably rely on volunteer help to prepare the shipments and that is still difficult with the social distancing requirements.

Also with the social distancing requirements we stopped doing pre-sort sessions with area clubs. Our last club sort was with the Candlewood Amateur Radio Club in the Danbury CT area. That was in early January 2020. Since then all our presorting has been done in-house with the help of local hams, Nancy N1KQP and Ann KA1PON. Even with the lower volume we still did our regular shipments out to the W1 call area hams.

The graph below shows our annual volume.

The numbers at the top of each bar is the volume less the W1AW cards. The W1AW cards are in red and they are from the ARRL Centennial activity. So without W1AW our volume has been dropping since 2014 with a slight uptick last year and probably an increase this year if it was not for COVID. The low sunspots, transitions to LoTW and other online systems, and the increased international shipping costs contribute to the decline in cards over the past several years. The increased activity with FT8 is probably the reason for the uptick in volume last year. 2020 also seems to have had an increase of activity on the air so that should drive volumes up.

The Bureau operates solely by the generous time of all our volunteers. Many of our Letter Sorters are part of the YCCC.

Raymond P. Bintliff – W1RY – Acton, MA – January 6, 2020



On January 6, 2020, Raymond P Bintliff passed away peacefully at home at the age of 97 and a half.

A brilliant engineer, Ray had a lifelong love of working with radios. He began tinkering with ham radios as a teenager and was trained in Radio Engineering during his US Naval service in WWII. When the war ended, he began a long career at RCA working to advance technology in the radio and television industries, including the development of color television technology. Among many accomplishments while at RCA, he was most proud to have helped manage the development and deployment of the Aegis Combat System and also negotiating RCA's defense contracts with the US government.

Ever the curious learner and teacher, he was just as busy after his "retirement", which was really just an excuse to spend more time on all of his passion projects. He taught ham radio classes for Acton Continuing Ed, served on the Acton Board of Assessors, worked as a Real Estate Appraiser, wrote articles for Antique Radio Classified, competed in and won ham radio contests (contacting every country in the world except for the one without reception) and authored books on radio history and repair...to name but a few. His true love was his side hustle, antique radio repair. People sent him radios from all over the world to be fixed and restored.

Most of all, Ray enjoyed people. He regularly emailed and spoke on the phone with friends from all periods of his life. He loved getting to know people. He loved a good chat. He loved making people smile. Always ready with a joke, he was the life of the party. He could talk to anyone about anything and loved learning from people. And he always left people better than he found them.

Ray will be remembered for his generous smile, quick wit and wicked sense of humor, boundless energy, strong work ethic, love for his family, brilliant mind and kind spirit.

Ray was predeceased by his loving wife of 74 years, Margaret (O'Mahony) Bintliff and his parents, Percy and Olivia Bintliff. He is survived by his daughters Leigh Bintliff and Christy Avery, son in law Jonathan Avery, granddaughters Amanda Alten and her husband Jason and Courtney Avery, his beloved great grandsons Hunter and Evan Alten and Shepard Moloney, and many friends.

Phil R. Lewis – N2MUN – Lindenhurst, NY – March 5, 2020



Phillip R. Lewis, N2MUN, the founder of Ham Radio University, passed away on March 5, 2020, after a long bout with cancer. He was 72. Phil was active right up until the end, participating in a meeting of his amateur radio club, the Order of Boiled Owls of New York, at their March monthly meeting only 3 days before his death.

Lewis was born in Brooklyn in '47 and grew up in Inwood in the Five Towns region of Nassau County, Long Island, New York. He graduated from RCA Institutes, America's oldest radio school, and worked in the aerospace industry for Hazeltine and later BAE Systems on Long Island. He retired after 43 years. Lewis was a manager and problem solver. He was very good

with people, had a positive outlook on life and would always find "a way" to get things done!

Lewis obtained his Amateur Radio license in '91 and upgraded to Amateur Extra Class. He joined the Great South Bay Amateur Radio Club and was on its board of directors, was an active volunteer examiner and an instructor for their license class exam courses. He was active on their Field Day committee and a participant in special event stations at Fire Island Lighthouse. He was GSBARC president from 2000 to 2002.

In 1999, Lewis had the idea of creating a day of education for amateur radio. With a small, dedicated group of Long Island hams, the notion of Ham Radio University (HRU) was formed. Phil Lewis was its first committee chairman, a distinction he held from 2000 to 2003. The first annual event was held in January 2000 at Babylon Town Hall Annex in North Babylon. HRU has since grown and expanded and is now being held at its fourth different location, LIU/Post in Brookville. HRU 2020 marked the 21st annual running. N2MUN gave two forums again this year and has been on the HRU committee since its inception.

On January 18, 2000, Lewis was featured in the Long Island newspaper Newsday in an article entitled, "Hamming it up on the air". For his work on behalf of Amateur Radio, Lewis was named the American Radio Relay League (ARRL) Hudson Division Amateur of the Year for the Year 2000. He was also a long-time ARRL Hudson Division Assistant Director and the ARRL New York City / Long Island Section Affiliated Club Coordinator.

Lewis kept himself busy in his retirement, building radio kits with his son, Steven, and daily activity on ham radio. He had a weekly on-air schedule with his cousin Marty in Virginia who was also a ham. Lewis was an active DX'er and Contester. He was a member of the Order of Boiled of New York and the Yankee Clipper Contest Club.

Besides contesting and DX'ing, Phil also enjoyed a "ragchew" on the air, easily conversing with people from all walks of life. Phil was an avid pet lover and his cats Lucky and Buddy graced his QSL cards and social media profile photos. He referred to them as his "non-paying family members".

Lewis is survived by his son, Steven, cousins Carol Goodman, from Manhattan, NY, and Marty from Viginia, and his many ham radio friends. He was predeceased by his wife Iris who died in 2011 and his brother Robert.



Roger E. Corey, born in 1921, and Dorothy (Haywood) Corey, born in 1916, first met in the spring of 1944 while both were stationed in West Palm Beach, Florida, with the Army Air Corps. Roger served as a radar specialist and Dorothy as a cryptographer. If asked, she had to tell folks she was a secretary, even though she helped tend the SIGABA machine, which decoders called 'the baby'. They dated for three months, married Sept. 2, and were inseparable for 75 years.

Roger grew up in Central Massachusetts and Dot, in Candor, North Carolina, on a peach farm. Before they met, Roger attended Worcester Polytechnic Institute and Dot went to Meredith

College, taught school and coached basketball. After the war they returned to Massachusetts, where Roger worked at the Raytheon Corporation and then the New England Telephone Company. Dot became a devoted wife and mother, an avid gardener and an active member of the First Baptist Church in Westwood, where they were long-time residents.

Keeping decades of diaries, they typed their memoirs and shared a lifetime of keepsakes, always including handwritten notes so that family might learn and remember their stories. Among those stories, Dot recalled itching



from the peach fuzz during harvest and their many dogs, all named Shep! She told of how she and her sister played barefoot over a precarious gold mine shaft nearby, and of the woman who helped her find a blue dress for her wartime wedding. Roger told of Worcester streetcars and Springfield horseshoe courts, of hunting with his father for food during the Depression, and of his Morse code/ham radio community from old states, like Rhodesia and the Kingdom of Siam. He also vividly recalled his first sighting of Dot, describing her copper hair, bright green dress and shapely figure! Always loving, noble and humble, they sweetly shrugged whenever anyone marveled at the improbable journey of their lives.

Roger (99) and Dot (103) succumbed to COVID-19 on April 25, 2020 and May 3, respectively.

Incredible parents, they dearly loved their family. Three sons, David of Shaftsbury, Vermont, James of Southborough, and John of Hopkinton, their sons. wives, Mary, Yola and Kris, their five grandchildren and their spouses, David and Rebekah, Jeffrey and Stephanie, Sarah and Todd, Danielle and David, and Michael, their six great-grandchildren, Lane, Luke, Eden, Micah, Liam and Wren, and many relatives and friends survive them. They will be greatly missed.

As W1JYH, living in the Connecticut River valley, Roger compiled huge scores in the Sweepstakes, DX tests and QSO parties. He and his neighbor W1EOB (N4XR) had many close races to the finish.

Roger was also active in Field day with the Connecticut Wireless Association. As a young contester Roger was always one of my heroes. When I got invited to take part in the CWA field day operation, I always looked forward to meeting Roger in Westwood and the opportunity to garner tidbits of contesting and DXing strategy on the drive to and from FD. Of course getting to see Roger and the other masters of the CW art operate was an experience I will never forget.

Roger was a member of the 128 Contest club, one of the predecessors of YCCC and a charter member of YCCC. He is the longest time US member of the First Class CW Operators Club (FOC). (Tnx QCWA # 2745, Chapter 4)
